For international students requesting school-provided transportation from **JFK**, John F. Kennedy International Airport, or **BDL**, Bradley International Airport, **reservations are necessary**. Please note that we do not provide transportation for domestic students or international traveling companions. Shuttles are designated for Cheshire Academy international students only.

Eligible international students wishing to reserve transportation will receive a sign-up form via email approximately three weeks prior to the travel dates outlined in this guide. Shuttle times are as follows:

August 29 – Pick Up for International Student Leaders

• Shuttle departs JFK, John F. Kennedy International Airport, New York, NY at 12 p.m. ET

August 31 – Pick Up for New and Returning International Students

- Shuttles depart **JFK**, John F. Kennedy International Airport, New York, NY between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. ET
- Shuttle departs BDL, Bradley International Airport, Hartford/Springfield, CT at 2 p.m. ET

For students arriving at JFK: A faculty member from Cheshire Academy will be on site at the airport to assist and supervise students who arrive on August 31. When considering shuttle departure times, please account for approximately two hours for baggage and customs clearance. Also, note that JFK Airport is two hours from campus.

If you signed up for transportation and miss your assigned shuttle due to a flight delay, you may need to arrange your own transportation to the Academy if no further shuttles are scheduled. Please note that the only airports we can provide shuttle service from are **JFK** (New York) and **BDL** (Hartford/Springfield). If you are arriving at a different airport, you will be responsible for your own transportation to campus.
