

Enjoy an afternoon sail and learn about the environment of Long Island Sound aboard the SoundWaters, an 80-foot, three-masted schooner ship.





With stunning views of the Connecticut River, this Tony Award-winning theatre offers a uniquely historic but charmingly modern experience.




▼ Wadsworth Atheneum. Hartford

▼ Essex Steam Train, Essex


