Shuttle Service for International Students with a Standard or Reduced Fee Package

International students with a standard or reduced international fee package may request school-provided transportation from John F. Kennedy International Airport, JFK, or Bradley International Airport, BDL. Reservations are necessary for shuttle service. Please note that Cheshire Academy does not provide transportation for domestic students, international students opting out of our fee packages, or international traveling companions. Shuttles are designated ONLY for Cheshire Academy International Students with a standard or reduced fee package.

Eligible students wishing to reserve transportation will receive a sign-up form via email approximately three weeks prior to the travel dates outlined in this guide. Shuttle times are as follows:

Transportation

for Domestic or International Students

For new international students with a standard or reduced fee package arriving at JFK on August 26: A faculty member from Cheshire Academy will be on site at the airport to assist and supervise students as they arrive. When considering shuttle departure times, please account for approximately 2 hours for baggage and customs clearance. Also note that JFK Airport is approximately 2 hours from campus.

If a student registers for transportation but misses their assigned shuttle due to a flight delay, the student may need to arrange their own transportation to the Academy if no further shuttles are scheduled. Please note that the only airports we provide shuttle service from are JFK (New York) and BDL (Harford/Springfield). If a student plans to arrive at a different airport, they will be responsible for their own transportation to campus.
